The Bachelor of Criminal Justice (BCJ) is intended for students who have already completed an applied associate's degree program in the criminal justice field from an accredited community college, regional campus, or technical college, and who wish to pursue a baccalaureate degree.

The guiding premise of the program is that the criminal justice system in America can be improved by providing a high-quality, liberal education to career-minded men and women. Upon graduation, you will have the opportunity for employment in law enforcement agencies, government agencies, and juristic and correctional agencies on the local, state, and federal levels, or in the private sector.

Since a bachelor's degree is rapidly becoming a minimum requirement for employment in this field, your chances for employment and advancement are strengthened greatly by this program.

Progress to the degree is assured by consultation at every stage of the program with an Ohio University academic advisor.

Degree Requirements

Minimum Quarter Hours to Graduate:

192 hours

Residency Requirements

- 48 quarter hours of Ohio University credit
- 50% of courses to fulfill major requirements must be Ohio University credit

Tier I Requirement

Math – Select 1 course

- MATH 111 + 112 or 113 (OHIO MATH 113)

English Composition

- ENGL 151 or COMM 122 + COMM 123 (OHIO ENG 151)
- OHIO junior composition course

Tier II Requirement

Students are required to complete a total of 32 credit hours from an approved list of courses in the six distribution areas. You are required to take at least three credit hours in each of the six areas and may satisfy no more than two of the required six areas with courses from the same department/school. In order to meet BCJ major course prerequisites, the following general education courses are required:

- PSYC 101 (OHIO PSY 101)
- SOCI 101 (OHIO SOC 101)
- GOVT 142 (OHIO POLS 101)

Tier III Requirement

- Select available option

BCJ Curriculum

Students must complete a minimum of 48 credit hours at Ohio University, including 50% of the courses required for the major. Students may not take more than five BCJ core/major courses at Hocking. Students will be expected to take one elective course at the 300/400 level; however, specific elective courses will not be delivered on a guaranteed schedule. Students must complete a total of 45 credit hours at the 300/400 level.

BCJ Requirements: Students must complete all three Core courses (C) and PSY 221.

Between Hocking and Ohio courses, students must complete all BCJ area requirements: 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D; 2A, 2B; 3A, 3B; 4A, and 4B.
