

# DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY: INTERACTIVE DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY/ SIMULATION

## Transfer Guide into the Ohio University Bachelor of Technical & Applied Studies

Students must complete a minimum of 48 credit hours at Ohio University, including 50% of the courses required for the major. Students may not take more than five (5) BTAS core/major courses at WSCC. If more than two (2) BTAS core/major courses are transferred in, students must replace the courses with Ohio University electives. *Specific elective courses will not be delivered on a guaranteed schedule.*

**BTAS REQUIREMENTS:** Students must complete all three TAS courses and PSY 221.

Between WSCC and Ohio University courses, students must complete

5 **Professional Skills** courses (P) with at least one course in each area (P1, P2, P3)

2 **Behavioral Skills** courses (B) with at least one course in each area (B1, B2)

2 **Leadership and Organization** courses (L)
